We were able to consider constructive criticism so that we can be the best learners possible, recognising that learning is a continuous learning journey. We were able to pose questions to our friends to help them to think more deeply about their investigation process and their planning of it. In English, we used a thinking routine called 'I see, I think, I wonder...' in order to teach ourselves the features of a Haiku. Why not test us out... can you write a Haiku with your child's instruction?





Voice 21

This year our school is involved in a project called Voice 21, developing oracy. Oracy is the ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language and listening. Oracy skills set children up for success in school and life.

In Voice 21 schools, you will hear students solving problems collaboratively in maths and dissecting arguments in history, talking through conflicts in the playground and leading assemblies. Like reading, writing and maths, children can learn oracy skills and they are vital to every aspect of school, work and creating healthy relationships with other people.
