## Diversity at Greenhaugh

At Greenhaugh one of our aims is to ensure that our children have lots of opportunities to encounter diversity and to reflect on why treating people fairly and as equals is important. We have shared stories of people such as Martin Luther King and Rosa Parks with the children and talked about how they were treated and how it might have made them feel. Our focus for World Book day was also on celebrating difference and treating everyone equally. We have also made sure that children access books that portray characters from a range of backgrounds and of different ethnicities.

Our work in RE, beginning to understand more about different religions, has been really important in helping children appreciate that people can be different and believe different things to you, but that you need to be respectful of their views and that understanding them will help you build friendships. Our trip to the church at Simonburn, the Hindu temple and our regular RE assemblies have allowed the children to remember things they have learnt and see them in real life! The governors recently interviewed some children on their understanding of diversity and were really impressed with their responses and their assertion that treating people fairly was hugely important.
