Class 1 news

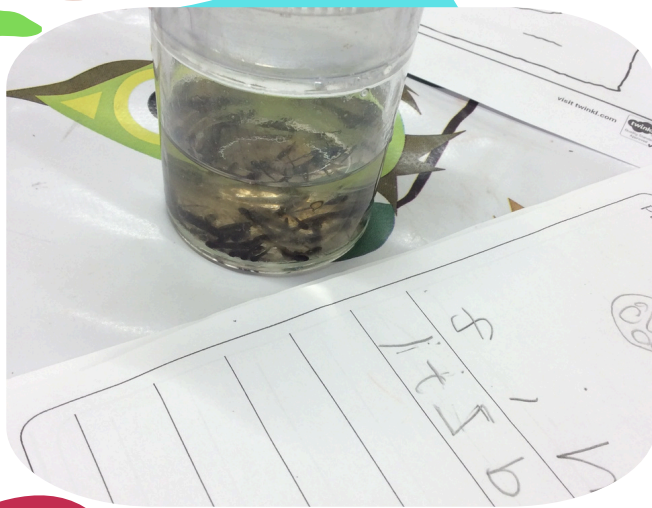
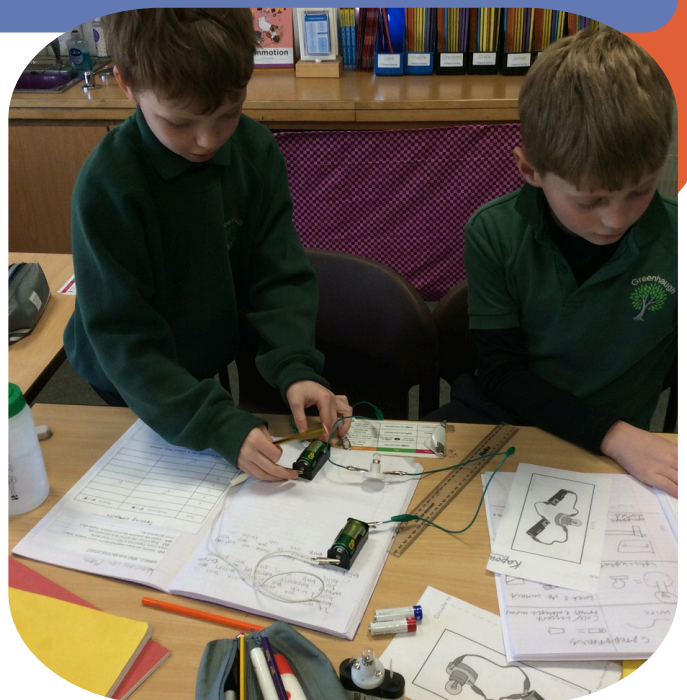
